I am Angharad Picton — an Intuitive Astrologer, Grief Alchemist, Qoya Teacher, Spiritual Guide and Evolutionist devoted to the sacred art of transformation.

Born in the UK and now rooted in the United States, I have lived and studied across several continents — including Egypt, Indonesia, Australia, Canada, and the UK — each land awakening deeper layers of remembrance within me. These global journeys have shaped a perspective that bridges ancient wisdom with modern consciousness, honoring Earth as teacher and initiator.

My path — marked by profound change and personal loss — has taught me that grief is not an ending but an initiation. It strips us bare until only truth remains, revealing the sacred potential within every unraveling. Through Intuitive astrology, embodiment, energy work and ceremony, I support others in transmuting grief into wisdom and reclaiming the soul's original light.

This pilgrimage, **Sacred Belonging**, arises from that devotion — an invitation to remember your ancient future, to reconnect with your soul's original path, and to awaken to the wisdom that lives both within and around you.

🜞 Why Peru — Why Now

This pilgrimage was born from a calling I received from the **ancient land of Tiwanaku** — a portal between worlds and a mirror for humanity's evolution.

Before the 2025 Spiritual Tour to Peru, I began receiving transmissions that spoke to what so many of us now feel: that we are living through a time of great remembering — the reactivation of human potential that has long lain dormant.

In the early hours of **November 5, 2025**, during a surge of solar activity, a message arrived:

"You are not being punished, nor abandoned.

You are being rewired.

The bridge between worlds is you."

These words revealed what this era is asking of us — to remember what we once knew: that humanity was never meant to live separate from the mystical.

The so-called new human is, in truth, an ancient human reawakening — a being of light and matter, intellect and intuition, logic and love.

Peru and Bolivia are living portals for this remembrance.

The temples of the Andes are not silent ruins — they are radiant transmitters of memory, designed to interface with the consciousness of those who approach them with reverence. When we enter these sacred sites with open hearts, their frequencies awaken our inner architecture — the crystalline pathways through which the mystic and the human merge.

Through this reconnection, we return to the harmonization of the **primordial universal principle of Ayni** — sacred reciprocity with all things.

We remember that every stone, river, mountain, and breath is alive with consciousness — that we are not separate but interwoven in a great web of living energy.

Here, we begin to direct our energy and intention toward the higher realms of **Munay** — the choice for love — to also heal our lineages both forward and backward through time.

This pilgrimage is a homecoming — a return to the living bridge between heaven and earth. Through movement, ceremony, and communion with these ancient lands, we awaken the ancient-future human within us: passionate, clear, and aligned with the heartbeat of creation itself.

We remember our **living legacy** — and begin to walk it with purpose.

K Living Lineage: The Weaving of Many Worlds

This pilgrimage is held within a tapestry of lineages — threads of wisdom that have woven through my life like constellations guiding me home.

I come from a long line of teachers and healers. My grandmother was a shaman who worked with the **Four Winds Society** under **Alberto Villoldo**, and through her I inherited the teachings of transformation through the elements, ceremony, and the cycles of death and rebirth.

My own initiatory path has unfolded across many worlds — ancient and modern, spiritual and embodied. I was initiated into **Usui Reiki**, later into **Holy Fire Reiki**, completing my **Master level**, and trained in **Pranic Healing**, **Psychotherapy**, and the **Metaphysics of Consciousness**. These initiations opened my awareness of energy, emotion, and the architecture of awakening — how light flows through the body as both teacher and medicine.

Parallel to this, my devotion to education became a sacred ministry in itself. Over **15 years in**Montessori education, I have guided, built, and rebuilt schools during times of transformation, helping communities remember how to learn, lead, and live with integrity. In this work, I came to understand that education, like healing, is an act of devotion to life.

In 2012, **Qoya** found me — and I found a movement language that united body and soul. Since then, it has been both my personal practice and a living temple of the feminine. As a **Qoya Teacher and Mentor**, I help train other teachers through intensives and rituals, honoring movement as prayer and remembrance as embodiment.

My studies in **Counseling, Homeopathy, and Intuitive Astrology** deepened my understanding of the human condition — how spirit and psyche mirror one another, and how every symptom and story carries a deeper message. My own journey through **grief** and recovery from a **debilitating back injury** became my greatest initiation into alchemy: the sacred art of transforming loss into wisdom, and pain into power.

In 2015, I first set foot on the sacred soil of **Peru** — and something ancient awakened in me. I knew then that I would one day lead others back to this land. Peru became a spiritual home, a living teacher. Even when I am not there, I feel its presence — its mountains whispering in my dreams, its rivers flowing through my spirit. It fills me with vitality and belonging beyond words.

In **2022**, I received the **Nusta Karpay**, the initiations of the seven Divine Feminine energies of the Andes, deepening my relationship with the Apus (mountain spirits), the waters, and the living soul of the Earth. These rites invited me into deeper communion with the feminine currents of creation — and marked the beginning of my role as a bridge between worlds.

Alongside these threads, I continue to study with **Joan Parisi Wilcox**, author of Masters of the Living Energy, through whom I have received **karpays** (initiations) from the Andean Masters — teachings aligned with the **Right** (**Paña**), **Left** (**Lloq'e**), and **Middle** (**Chaupi**) paths of living

energy (Kawsay). These transmissions anchor my practice in the Andean principle of **Ayni** — sacred reciprocity — the living balance of giving and receiving that flows through all of creation.

My lineage, therefore, is not bound to one tradition — it is a **living synthesis**: a weaving of body, spirit, and Earth; of education, energy, and evolution.

It is the remembrance that transformation is not learned — it is lived.

And from that lived experience, I hold space for others to remember who they are, why they came, and how to live their light in service to life.

Alipio Quispe — a Q'ero healer and wisdom keeper, embodies the sacred Masculine of the Andes. A lifetime of ceremony and devotion has made him a guardian of the Apus and a master of energy work, leading us through Despachos, Karpays, and ceremonies that awaken ancestral memory and healing.

→ Benita Quispe — Alipio's wife and a holder of the Rainbow Lineage of Healing, carries within her the wisdom of generations of healers from her familial line. She embodies the radiant Divine Feminine — tender, wise, and heart-centered — balancing Alipio's Masculine essence. Together, they hold the sacred union of Yanantin, the perfect harmony of duality, supporting each traveler to awaken this inner union within themselves.

Together, we weave spiritual wisdom, cultural authenticity, and embodied practice — holding a sacred container for transformation, remembrance, and deep belonging.

Our time together culminates in a **Karpay (initiation)** — a rite of spiritual awakening preparing us for the evolutionary cycles now unfolding. Day 1 – June 17: Arrival in the Sacred Valley



Descent into the Heart of Pachamama

This morning, we fly to Cusco — the navel of the Inkan world — then descend into the lush Sacred Valley. Descending in altitude mirrors the descent into your own heart, where this

pilgrimage truly begins. The mountains greet us like ancient sentinels, each Apu holding codes of light older than time.

A welcome picnic awaits along the Urubamba River, surrounded by emerald terraces and crystalline air. Here, we open our journey in a circle of belonging — grounding, clearing, and remembering why we came. Through breath, movement, and the first notes of Qoya, we begin to attune to the living pulse of these lands.

Evening arrives like a prayer, soft and golden. Allow the sound of wind through the valley to remind you that you are part of something vast, ancient, and intimately alive.

Day 2 - June 18: Pumamarca & Pisac

Communion with the Winds of the Ancestors

Today, we journey upward to the crystalline heights of Pumamarca — a lesser-known Inkan site where the air itself feels like ceremony. Here, the wind becomes a teacher, whispering stories of civilizations who remembered how to speak with mountains and stars. As we offer a *Despacho* to Pachamama, the sacred exchange of Ayni awakens — we give thanks, and the land responds.

We share a Pachamanca feast, food cooked in the earth itself — a communion between fire, stone, and soil. Each flavor carries the memory of the ancestors. The laughter of local families, the scent of herbs, and the hum of the wind all weave into a tapestry of belonging.

Later, we wander the temple of Pisac — a spiraling journey through terraces that echo the cosmic geometry Freddy Silva calls "living architecture." Every stone is an intelligence, every step a remembering.

This day is devoted to stillness and deep integration. We visit the Moon Temples — ancient sanctuaries where water mirrors light, and the feminine mysteries of the Andes speak through stone and silence. Here, under the moon's invisible gaze, we listen.

You may feel your body attuning to the valley's resonance, your heart syncing with the cosmic rhythm encoded in these mountains. Allow yourself to soften. The Sacred Valley is a mother — and like any mother, she knows how to hold what we have not yet learned to hold ourselves.

In the evening, we gather for a gentle integration circle, anchoring the insights that have begun to awaken within.

Sound, Frequency, and the Remembering of Wholeness

Today we journey to Wilka Rocca — the Temple of the Sacred Heart — where sound becomes the bridge between the visible and invisible worlds. The ancient stones here hum with memory; each tone, each vibration, is a living thread in the songline of creation. This is a place of sonic initiation, where the resonance of the Andean flute and drum remind our cells of the original rhythm of the cosmos.

We enter this temple as pilgrims of frequency, releasing through movement and breath all that is discordant, allowing the harmonic field of the land to realign us. Within this sacred space, the boundaries between body and Earth dissolve — and we remember that we, too, are instruments of the Divine.

Day 5 – June 21: Machu Picchu – The Crystal Condor



The Solstice of Illumination

The Solstice dawns, and with it, the long-awaited ascent to Machu Picchu — the shining city of the sun, suspended between heaven and Earth. Boarding the train along the Urubamba River feels like traveling through a dreamscape, each curve of the mountains a gateway between worlds.

At the sanctuary, we walk where initiates once gathered to align their hearts with the solar disk. The temples — of the Sun, of the Condor, of the Three Windows — still pulse with coded light. Graham Hancock calls this site a "memory of a forgotten epoch," and you can feel it: a vibration older than time, alive in the stone.

Here, in ceremony, we open to the light that illuminates from within. The Condor — messenger of the heavens — spreads its crystalline wings, inviting us to rise beyond fear and to remember our original flight.

Evening falls in Aguas Calientes, surrounded by rivers and jungle mist. Let the sacred stillness of this day settle into your bones.

Day 6 - June 22: Chinchero & Cusco - Threads of Belonging



Weaving the Cosmic and the Human

As we journey back toward Cusco, we stop in the high village of Chinchero, where sky meets snow-capped peaks. Here, women still weave stories into cloth — each thread a prayer, each color a vibration of the natural world. Watching them spin the wool, you can feel the ancient

continuity of life's fabric. We are reminded that everything — our grief, our joy, our love — is part of the great weaving.

We visit the shimmering Piuray Lagoon, where we offer our gratitude to the waters — the mirror between worlds. In Andean cosmology, water is the bridge between dimensions, the carrier of memory. As we offer flowers and intention to this sacred lake, we participate in the oldest form of prayer: reciprocity.

The evening brings us to Cusco — the beating heart of the Inkan empire — where cobblestone streets hum with ancient codes beneath the modern bustle. We move through a gentle Qoya practice to embody all that we've received and prepare for the next chapter of the pilgrimage.

The Waters of Illumination

This morning we journey to Tipon, the Temple of Flow — one of the most exquisite water temples in the Andean world. Here, crystalline streams descend through finely carved stone channels that have carried the same water for centuries. Each stream is said to represent the four sacred directions, the four aspects of self, the eternal flow of reciprocity between Heaven and Earth.

As the water murmurs through the terraces, you can feel it cleansing your emotional body, washing through memory and time. This is a day for surrender — for learning the sacred art of allowing. In meditation and silence, we let Tipon teach us how to live in harmony with the current of life itself.

Later, we gather in circle to integrate, grounding the wisdom of flow into the bones.

Day 8 - June 24: Inti Raymi - Festival of the Sun



The Great Solar Rebirth

On this Solstice morning, Cusco awakens in celebration. Inti Raymi — the Festival of the Sun — is one of the most sacred ceremonies in the Andean calendar, a living remembrance of the time when humanity walked in direct communion with the solar consciousness.

At Sacsayhuamán, beneath the gaze of the Apus, we join thousands who have gathered to honor the return of the Sun. Music, color, and sacred drama weave together in an ancient language of gratitude. This is not a performance — it is an invocation. You can feel the pulse of light entering your body, igniting the inner fire of transformation.

Later, we hold a private Solstice ceremony — a moment outside of time — to anchor this transmission within. The golden current of Inti (the Sun) merges with the emerald heart of Pachamama, awakening the sacred marriage of Heaven and Earth within each of us.

Day 9 – June 25: Vinicunca – The Rainbow Mountain



Initiation into the Seven Rays of Creation

We depart before dawn for the high Andes — traveling through luminous landscapes where herds of alpaca graze and Quechua songs carry on the wind. The air grows thinner, clearer, charged with an almost electric stillness. By the time we reach the foot of Vinicunca — the Rainbow Mountain — we are standing at nearly 17,000 feet, among the guardians of the sky.

The colors of the mountain ripple in bands of rose, gold, and turquoise — the Earth revealing her own sacred spectrum. Here, we perform ceremony with the *mamacoca* leaves and sacred tobacco, offering our breath and prayers to the mountain spirits. Each color holds a frequency of creation, and as you ascend, you are attuned to the seven rays of light that compose your multidimensional self.

We break for a simple picnic lunch before continuing south to Sicuani, resting in the heart of the Andes.

Day 10 – June 26: Sillustani → Puno – Keepers of the Ancestors



The Stone Towers of Memory

This morning we journey to Sillustani — a windswept plateau overlooking Lake Umayo, where the ancient Colla people built towering chullpas as portals between life and death. The towers face east, aligned with the rising Sun — a symbol of eternal renewal and the soul's journey beyond form.

Here, we hold ceremony for the ancestors, acknowledging the continuum of time. As Graham Hancock has written, places like this are "points of remembrance in humanity's long amnesia." You can feel it in the stones — a pulse, a hum, a knowing that death is but a passage into new light.

We move slowly, with reverence, tracing our fingers over the carvings of serpents and pumas — symbols of transformation and power. The land opens its heart in silence.

As we continue toward Puno and the shimmering expanse of Lake Titicaca, we carry with us the memory of all who came before, and the deep peace that comes from knowing we are never alone in this great turning of souls.

Day 11 – June 27: Aramu Muru → Tiwanaku — The Doorway Between Worlds



Crossing the Threshold of Remembrance

We rise with the light and travel toward the southern shore of Lake Titicaca, where red stone mountains cradle one of the most mysterious sites in Peru — **Aramu Muru**, the interdimensional doorway carved into solid rock.

The local people call this place *Puerta de los Dioses* — the Gate of the Gods — a threshold where shamans, monks, and initiates have passed in ceremony for millennia.

As we approach, the wind stills. The surface of the rock glows as though lit from within. We stand before the portal in silence, hearts open, and feel the subtle vibration that hums through the red stone — the resonance between worlds. With offerings of coca, sound, and breath, we honor this gateway as symbol and living presence — a reminder that awakening is not an ascent but a remembrance of what already lives within.

Later, we cross into **Bolivia**, where the energy shifts again — the pulse deep, magnetic, ancient. We arrive at Tiwanaku village and ground our energy in circle, letting the land begin to speak to us in its own language of light and shadow.

Day 12 - June 28: Tiwanaku & Puma Punku — The Architects of Eternity



Communion with the Mothers of Civilization

Today we walk upon one of the oldest ceremonial cities on Earth — **Tiwanaku**, cradle of pre-Inkan wisdom, a place Matías de Stefano calls one of the "original memory points of the planetary grid." The stones here do not simply *stand* — they *speak*. Every angle, every groove, every interlocking shape is geometry encoded with consciousness.

We visit the **Akapana Pyramid**, the **Kalasasaya Temple**, and the **Gates of the Sun and Moon**, each aligned with celestial precision. Here, we listen to the stories embedded in basalt — of the mothers and star-builders who remembered how to shape matter through vibration. At **Puma Punku**, the mystery deepens: megaliths carved with impossible perfection, some say remnants of a civilization that bridged heaven and earth.

We gather for ceremony upon the land — calling in the Solar and Lunar currents, the balance of creation and dissolution, masculine and feminine, sky and stone. Through Qoya movement and sound, we allow these frequencies to integrate through our bodies as living temples of remembrance.

Day 13 – June 29: Tiwanaku Immersion — Listening to the Stone People

The Silent Transmission of Time

This day is one of deep listening and open exploration. There is no rush, no fixed plan — only resonance and choice. Some may feel called to revisit a particular temple, others to spend time in meditation beside the Sun Gate or to explore the local museum that houses relics of unfathomable age.

You may wish to sit with a local wisdom-keeper or simply lie upon the earth, feeling the hum beneath your spine — the heartbeat of Tiwanaku herself. This is the day where integration happens not through doing but through *being*.

As dusk paints the plains in gold, we gather one last time beneath the stars for our evening circle — honoring the teachings of these lands and sealing the field of transformation we've woven together. Later, we travel to **La Paz**, descending from the high plateau into the city lights, carrying the stillness of the temples within us.

Itinerary Details:

- Optional return to Tiwanaku temples or museum visit
- Time with local teachers / guardians of the land
- Group ceremony or Qoya in resonance with what emerges
- Evening circle and transfer to La Paz

Day 14 - June 30: La Paz - Return to the World

Integration and Completion

Our pilgrimage concludes in **La Paz**, a city suspended in a bowl of mountains — a meeting of the old world and the new. We spend the morning wandering through the **Witches' Market**, where healers offer herbs, resins, and talismans still blessed by the Andean winds. We visit the **San Francisco Cathedral** and **Plaza Murillo**, feeling the fusion of colonial and indigenous

worlds. Then, rising above the city in the sky-bound cable car, we take in a final panorama — Pachamama's vastness stretching to the horizon.

In our **closing circle**, we gather one last time to offer gratitude — to the lands, the ancestors, the companions who have walked beside us, and the selves we have become. A farewell meal brings laughter, tears, and the sweetness of completion.

Tonight, as we journey homeward through Lima and beyond, the pilgrimage continues — for the true temple now lives within you. You have walked the spine of the Andes, and she has remembered your name.
